‘Fish to Fish’

John 1:1-3, Luke 5:1-11, John 21:1-6, 15-17

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The following questions are intended to use in discussion and application of the past week’s sermon.

Listening

What part of the sermon was most helpful to you or challenged you to think and/or live differently? How will you apply this message to your life?

Engaging

Have someone read John 1:1-18. As we enter into Holy Week - leading up to Good Friday and Resurrection Sunday – how can we ensure our grasp of who Jesus is is far more than a righteous martyr? How can the cosmic, surpassing truths in this passage help us?

Peter and several other disciples’ stories often includes circumstances around fishing. Being their profession and a necessary staple of their economy, what sorts of circumstances or professions would his parables and miracles be contextualized in in our time?

Applying

Jesus could have called fisherman day after day for months to build a larger group of disciples. He chose to call a few and be uniquely intimate with them through life. Do you see this model of intimate relationship and discipleship played out in your life? Why or why not?

Pastor Foth said, “God will do whatever it takes to get our attention.” While this can be an exciting, endearing reality, it can also be the grounds by which people only respond in times of trial and struggle. What ways are you ensuring that you are ‘paying attention’ to the Lord?
