Exodus 3:2-6, 13:21-22, 19:18, 1 Peter 1:6-7 DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The following questions are intended to use in discussion and application of the past week's sermon.

Listening

What part of the sermon was most helpful to you or challenged you to think and/or live differently? How will you apply this message to your life?

Engaging

Before God began the miraculous works of the Exodus, there were many generations of struggle and oppression that the Hebrew people endured. Have someone read Exodus 2:23-25 and discuss your feelings, reactions, and questions.

Can you recall other aspects of the biblical theme of fire (where else in Scripture does it appear, how else is the work of God connected to fire)? The mighty and intense nature of this element of God's Nature is multifaceted and vast!

Applying

Pastor John shared that many things are made better through fire. Can you recall times where trials of refining resulted in an improved state of things in your life?

As we invited in each of week's studies, challenge one another to spend some amount of time later this week around a fire (like a campfire). What comes to mind as you consider the nature of God in this aspect of God's nature?

Praying
