If you've spent any time at TSM, you know that we don't want Jesus to just be a moment in our week or life; we want Him to be a movement in our lives. We are so excited that you are starting this journey of making Jesus a movement in your life - it's going to be amazing!

## TIME WITH JESUS

Do you ever wish God would just talk to you? That would be incredible, wouldn't it? I feel like I would want to say a lot, but it would probably be better to just listen. I have never heard the audible voice of God, but there are many times I wish I had. Like when I asked: What I should do, What I should say? This has often made me frustrated, "God, why can't you just tell me what you want?!"

But every time I ask those questions, it's because I've forgotten that He *has* spoken to us. In fact, He speaks very clearly through His Word, through His Spirit in us, and through His Church or the other Christian people around us. The real question is, am I noticing? Am I taking a few minutes to pause my busy and distracted life to listen for Jesus?

Spending time with Jesus is something that is easy, simple, and worth the time. In fact, it will quickly become something that brings you strength, hope, and purpose for your day. So, how do we go about spending time with the Creator of the Universe? Here are a few ways to start, but don't be intimidated! The goal is to engage with Jesus and draw closer to Him, not check something off the Christian "To Do List".

#### WHAT CAN I DO?

Unplug: Let's be honest, we are constantly distracted with all kinds of things: phones, tv, video games, people, a bird that just flew by (Well, birds distract me at least, I don't know about you). Take a second and put your phone on airplane mode, turn the tv off, and be by yourself so you can notice what God is saying to you.

3x5: Take 5 minute to do 3 different things to engage and connect with Jesus.

TAKE 5 MINUTES TO READ. Start by reading the Bible for 5 minutes (try starting with Psalm 1). The Bible is split up in two different sections the Old Testament that talks about the history of creation and God's people, and the New Testament, the story of how Jesus brings hope and forgiveness to the world and the Kingdom of God on earth. If you have never read the Bible before, start in the book of John (New Testament) and the Psalms (Old Testament).

| TAKE 5 MINUTES TO WRITE. Last week I was with a mentor of mine and he was talking about looking back over the last 50 years of his life. He was asked "Looking back, what is something you wish you would have changed?" He paused, thought, and shared, "I wish I would have written things down more often, to see what God had done, what I was praying and how He responded. When we put things into writing or say it out loud, things that happened become reality. Take a few minutes to write about what God has done, what are you asking of Him, what is a big win in your faith or a big challenge in your faith who are you praying for and why. |

TAKE 5 MINUTES TO PRAY (Matthew 6:5-6). Prayer does not need to be complex, but instead is a simple, respectful, conversation between you and God. Here are some ways you can pray: Praise or honor God for who He is (John 14:6), Say who He is, repeat what scripture says about who God is. Confess things that you have done wrong or ways you've sinned (1 John 1). Thank God for all that He has done for you and for others. Ask God for help for you and for others (Phil 4:6). Another thing that can help some people engage with God is music that worships or focuses our heart and mind on who He is. For me, writing my prayers out helps me focus and remember what I am thankful for and what I'm asking God to do.

Spending time with Jesus is an incredible gift, but it can also be a huge challenge to make it happen. Find the best way that you learn, and you engage with God. For me, I engage best through Scripture reading or memorizing, and worship music. There have been many trail runs and workouts in my life that ended with less sweat and more engagement with God. If you don't sit still well, go run and listen to music that honors God and pray. If you love reading and writing, read and write until you run out of paper. The important piece is connection between you and God!

#### WANT TO GO FURTHER?

When I was 15, I had a leader challenge me to pray for an hour every day for 1 week. I thought he was crazy, there was no way I could do that once, but 7 times, there was no way! Even though I thought it was impossible, I took him up on the challenge. Every day when I got home from school, I went to my room with no phone or tv and prayed. Day 1 was rough, what do I even say to the God that created me? Day 2 I began to see that as I slowed my life down and opened up to Jesus, prayer was so much more than it had ever been. It is a constant two-way connection to the God of hope, strengthen, and encouragement. Will you take the challenge?

Need some structure? Pray for each area for 5-7 minutes:

- Worship God for who He is, His character, what He has done.
- Confess: offer Him your faults, your errors, your pride.
- Give thanks to God for what He has done in your life.
- Ask Him for help, requests for you and for others.
- Pray for your friends that know Jesus.
- Pray for friends that don't know Jesus to encounter Him.
- Pray for your school, work, community, nation, sports team.
- Pray for yourfamily.
- Pray for your future.

Write down notes of what you pray so you can see how God is answering you.

## **RELATIONSHIPS**

#### PASTOR JUSTIN MATTHEWS

When I was in middle school I went to a meeting at my church and said "yes" to Jesus. It was awesome and I was immediately on fire and excited to follow Jesus. Then that fire ran out because no one told me what to do next. I didn't have a clue that Jesus was supposed to change my entire life and not just my answer when people asked, "Are you a Christian?"

Late into my high school career, I met a guy named Josh Dillion. Josh was a Christian Club leader at the high school I attended, and he pursued a friendship with me that was different than any other friendship I had. Josh asked me hard questions and challenged me to follow Jesus in a very new way. Josh showed me that following Jesus was adventurous and fun. Josh told me that following Jesus changes your entire life and not just Sunday at church and Wednesday at small group. I learned that the people I hung out with mattered.

There is a saying that goes, "Show me your friends and I'll show you your future". I really believe this is true. Who you surround yourself with matters and is extremely important? Life is tough and God didn't intend for you to do it alone. A writer name John Ortberg says, "When you say yes to Jesus you say yes to community". Community comes with Jesus and it's important.

Who is more important, the guy on the mat or the friends?

What is important about what the paralyzed man's friends did for him?

These guys had a friend in need, and they brought him to the feet of Jesus. As followers of Jesus, it's our job to bring our friends to the feet of Jesus when they are in need.

Bringing someone to Jesus can look a lot of different ways. It can look like praying for a friend whether they ask for it or not. It can be holding someone accountable for their actions. It can be as simple as giving someone biblical advice.

Just as it is our responsibility to take our friends to Jesus, it's our friend's job to take us there when we need it (and you will).

Josh Dillion took me and introduced me to Jesus. He refused to let me walk through life alone. I say that Josh Dillion is the reason I still follow Jesus today, because he showed me how. Maybe you feel like you don't have this person in your life. My challenge to you is to find that person. At TSM we have leaders who would love nothing more than to be that for you. It might seem weird or scary, but I promise it is worth it. Take a step. Don't just be paralyzed on a mat. Ask your friends or TSM leader to take you to Jesus.

## **TEACHINGS**

#### PASTOR TIMHEIST

Some of the biggest influences for me and my faith have been things that people have said or that I have read that challenged me. Sometimes things just stand out or jump off the pages and smack you in the face. I picture the infamous Wile E Coyote getting an idea... ding... a light bulb pops above his head. Maybe you've experienced this when you heard someone speak (like a Pastor at church) reading the Bible, or through a small group discussion. For me, it was a recreation of the Old Testament tabernacle at the church I grew up in. It was massive and true to the description from the Bible, but the thing I remember most - the fire. There was a ton of fire. They had candle sticks all around, and a huge altar where they would make sacrifices. This one had real flames that burned 4-5 feet high, it might just be the fire that got my attention, but either way, seeing that recreation began to bring the stories that I read in the Bible about the Israelites to life.

I also think of mentors in my life teaching me about the full story of Jesus. They taught me things like: God's will (or His plans for His people) is a field we get to run in, not a tight rope we fall off if we make a mistake. That the mission that we, as Christians, are called to is always being people focused. Or the time I first read Philippians 2 and it jumped off the page!

One of the main purposes of God leaving His Spirit (sometimes we call this the Holy Spirit) with us on earth is to bring to life or illuminate Scripture to us. When we read God's Word, it is not just us reading a book, but the Spirit of God bringing it to life in our lives.

#### READ 1 CORINTHIANS 2:11-16.

In this passage Paul, the author, gets really deep. He is saying, that when we believe in what Jesus did and take His way of life, the Holy Spirit becomes a part of us and we pick up this spiritual mind, one that can understand the spiritual things that He does. I always picture this like a word search. Look at it as one thing and it is just a jumble of letters, but once you know where the words are you can't unsee them. The same is true with Scripture, the Spirit reveals God's instructions to us, words, and wisdom. We must also confirm meanings and not just assume we understand everything, so check what you are learning with other truths from Scripture, history, and through study.

What has this looked like in your life? Is there a time that scripture jumped out and was exactly what you needed in your life? Is there a sermon or teaching you just can't forget? Maybe something someone said to you that you just can't move past?

#### **READ 1 CORINTHIANS 2:14**

There are a few things to remember. The first is that sometimes God seems quiet, but in those times of quiet let's not forget the times He spoke. Maybe we need to go back to those things and be sure we are hearing and doing them! Let's also remember that the Bible is God's words to us, so if God seems quiet jump into His Word. The second is if your soul, your spirit being, is often recharged in a specific way (teachings, podcasts, videos, reading scripture, small groups, etc.) Stay engaged in those ways. Isolation, or not staying connected is the enemy to growing in your faith!

## **ACCEPTING HIS GRACE DAILY**

Ever since I can remember, I have always been super hard on myself. Even though I grew up in a Christian home, I didn't really understand the meaning of grace. I thought God would lose his patience with me every time I messed up. Relationships are very important to me, but sometimes that gets twisted into being a bit of a people pleaser. I thought that if I messed up, God wouldn't love me as much. In high school, and even in college, I have always been the type of person that needed to feel accepted. I took cues from others. I felt obligated to say yes to all sorts of social invitations out of fear. It sounds crazy but maybe you have been this way too? I struggled with FOMO (fear of missing out) in a big way. As a girl, I also sought those feelings of being valued and loved through relationships with guys. It felt good to be called pretty, funny, or fun, to the point where if I wasn't talking to some guy that could be interested, I felt like nothing.

But over the past few years, I have begun to realize that Jesus loves me on my bad days, as much as my good days. He is crazy about me just as I am. In fact, He created me in His image. I have learned overtime, that the one who will always accept and love me for better or for worse is Jesus. I am going to mess up again, because I'm human, but I know that Jesus always wants to forgive me as soon as I ask. That's the beauty of grace and Jesus's promise to always be there for me. Our identity, our worth is only of value when we are living according to how Jesus would see us, as if He were walking right alongside us.

Growing up I played soccer and before every game I used to write the verse Psalm 3:3 on my wrist. When I made bad decisions, let temptation get the best of me, didn't think before I spoke, or just had a terrible game, I remembered this: "But you, O Lord, are a shield about me. My glory, and the lifter of my head." People will fail, I will fail, but Jesus's love for me never fails; it's never less than ALL His love, ALL the time.

So, my question for you is where do you find your value? Is it through people, sports, music, hobbies, or things? Do you truly understand how much God loves you no matter how much you do? The first step is accepting His grace daily.

Remember that it's okay not to be 100% every day. In fact, on our bad days, instead of running to someone or something else, that's when we need to lean into praying to Jesus more.

One of the best ways I could describe grace would be responding out of love even if the other person doesn't deserve it.

#### READ 1 CHRONICLES 17:7-10

We see here Nathan the prophet talks about how David (the man after God's own heart) will be a true example of God's continued grace. Of course, David began as the youngest son – the "runt" of the litter. He experienced failure, loss, and even made terrible mistakes. But God's love for David never wavered.


