DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The following questions are intended to use in discussion and application of the past week's sermon.

Listening

What part of the sermon was most helpful to you or challenged you to think and/or live differently? How will you apply this message to your life?

Engaging

Read Ephesians 6:10-12 and 4:14. Discuss what you think it means that there are harmful, evil 'schemes' at work in our world and in people's lives.

In light of such evil 'schemes', we are instructed and expected to play an active role in defending ourselves and others. As Paul lays out the armor of God, are there any components you feel especially familiar and well-used in your life? Any elements of the armor you tend to neglect?

Applying

So much (so very much) of Paul's survive and thrive plans for the Ephesians have been around the unity and togetherness of their faith. Have your discussions, investments in one another, or just time spent together drawn you closer with others in this series? Has anything surprised you about your time together? What would you say (or maybe what should you say) to believers that, for whatever reason, aren't experiencing that sort of Christian community as a regular part of their life?
