Living Whole in a Fractured World: A Letter from James "Whole People Express Faith Through Works"

This provides about one hour of focused reading and discussion. Use the portions you find most helpful.

Open with 7-minute video clip, F. Chan, The Book of James 2:14-26 (RightNowMedia).

- 1. Let's be people who allow God's word to **confront** us James is **blunt.**
 - Read James 1:22-25, James 2:14, Luke 6:46-49, 2 Timothy 4:2-4, Ephesians 2:8-10, and Revelation 3:15-16. How do you respond when you reflect on these verses, especially when James confronts the kind of faith that makes no difference?
- 2. Let's be people who give ourselves to **listening** to and **looking at** God's Word.
 - Read James **1:22** and **25** again, along with **Romans 2:13**. How are we deceiving ourselves if we just listen to God's Word?
 - Read Romans 8:2. How has following God's "law of freedom" affected your own life?
- 3. Let's be people who know that **disobedience** leads to self-**deception**.
 - Read **James 1:22** and **24.** How well do I recognize my own need to change? How does reading God's word impact that process?
- 4. Freedom comes from **remembering** and walking in **faithfulness**.
 - Read James 1:25, James 2:21-26, Genesis 15:6, and Genesis 22:1-3. How does Abraham's example prove that "faith without works is useless"?
 - Why do you think James mentions Rahab, a prostitute, as an example of good works?
- 5. Works are about practical **care** and not just personal **morality**.
 - "Faith always has a social component and affects our relationship with others," according to Jeff Lucas. Read James 2:15-26, Luke 3:8-11, 1 John 3:16-19, Deuteronomy 15:7-8, Proverbs 19:17, and Micah 6:8. Discuss what stands out about these passages.
