

God's Nature – Tracing His Fingerprints 'Wind'

John 3:1-8, Acts 2:1-2
DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The following questions are intended to use in discussion and application of the past week's sermon.

Listening

What part of the sermon was most helpful to you or challenged you to think and/or live differently? How will you apply this message to your life?

Engaging

In John 3 Jesus explains that the way that you can discern the movement of the wind is to see how it is moving things that you can see. What are ways that we can discern the spirit or wind of the Lord moving in people's lives?

Have someone read Acts 2:1-4. This is an example of the Spirit of the Lord moving in a way that can't easily be explained or foreseen. What do we glean from experiences like this in how we can respond or prepare to respond to the movement of the Spirit/wind?

Applying

Can you recall times where you have fought against ways that you have felt the Spirit moving or pushing you? What was the result?

Can you recall times where you have allowed the Spirit to move or drive you? What was the result?

As we invite in each week's studies, we want to challenge people to engage in the element of God's Nature that the message talked about (in this case, wind). While that may not be feasible (or desired), in what ways might we engage with the powerful and directing nature of the wind? What comes to mind as you consider the nature of God in this aspect of God's nature?

Praying

In light of this message and discussion:

How can we pray for each other? Where do you feel challenged or convicted?

What can we praise God for? How can we pray for our church?
