

PLAYLIST – Bring your heart and voice 'Come Back Together In Worship'

Genesis 2:18, John 17:20-26, 2 Corinthians 5:18-19

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The following questions are intended to use in discussion and application of the past week's sermon.

Listening

What part of the sermon was most helpful to you or challenged you to think and/or live differently? How will you apply this message to your life?

Engaging

Study Jesus's High Priestly Prayer (John 17:20-26) together as a group. What do you observe in his language and in the repetition? How does the context of this being recorded by John as an audible prayer shape what we should understand from this?

It is to be expected that people become passionate about their musical preferences. How will we know whether our musical choices and preferences have actually become something that divides us from other believers instead of serving as an activity that is supposed to bring us together? What are the points of worship we must share to have true unity?

Applying

What are some of your favorite or most memorable times of singing together alongside others? Describe the situation and share why it has made such an impact on you.

Pastor John talked about the dual purpose of audible prayers – directed to God and also received by those around us. In light of some of the below prompts or encouragements the Lord may put on your hearts, consider practicing audible prayers together for connecting with the Spirit together.
