

PLAYLIST – Bring your heart and voice 'Encouragement'

Mark 1:40-45, John 8:1-11, Matthew 26:30-75

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

The following questions are intended to use in discussion and application of the past week's sermon.

Listening

What part of the sermon was most helpful to you or challenged you to think and/or live differently? How will you apply this message to your life?

Engaging

As Pastor Donny challenged us, try to put yourself in Peter's shoes on the night of Jesus's trial and ultimate crucifixion. As the night progresses, Peter's struggle continues to reveal itself, and yet still he is lingering around the area (as opposed to fleeing). Discuss the sort of thoughts you might see in Peter's actions that night.

Have someone read John 8:1-11. What does Jesus's response to the stone-throwers reveal about God's heart towards our very real flaws? How is that heart different than the stone-throwers? Which heart do you tend to default to in confronting the very real sins of others?

Applying

Share some of your most encouraging or empowering times of singing in worship alongside others. What made that experience so encouraging? Do you think that is the sort of thing God desires you to participate in again? Are there things that you can do that you might be able to experience something like that again?

Pastor Donny said when we recall the times where God has clearly showed up for us, it puts us in a spiritual posture of being encouragement and singing our praise to God. Can you recall a time(s) when God clearly showed up?

Praying

In light of this message and discussion:

How can we pray for each other? Where do you feel challenged or convicted?

What can we praise God for? How can we pray for our church?
