## **‘We Become Like What We Worship’**

John 4:19-24, Exodus 32:4-5, Psalm 19:14, 34: 16-18, 89:14

### **DISCUSSION QUESTIONS**

*The following questions are intended to use in discussion and application of the past week's sermon.*

#### **Listening**

What part of the sermon was most helpful to you or challenged you to think and/or live differently? How will you apply this message to your life?

#### **Engaging**

Consider scenes at a concert or other music-related engagement where passion and devotion seem to overflow. Discuss what it is that you think that is all about. Beyond church services or worship concerts can you relate to experiences like that?

Jesus's conversation with the woman at the well (John 4:1-30) serves as a personal and also overarching exploration of the heart, the truth, of the practices of worship. In this particular conversation the geographical location was prominent. Can you think of other practices of worship stand as barriers or distinctions between traditions of faith?

#### **Applying**

What songs do you generally surround yourself with on a given day? Does it change based on the setting or your mood? When you choose to listen to a certain kind of music, what are you after?

Pastor Brent shared that the musicians and songwriters function as the theologians of our day, because the lyrics we sing in reflection to or about God are a key way many people develop and express our beliefs. What has been your experience in considering and expressing the lyrics you sing or listen to? Is there an opportunity for you to examine these things a little more?

#### **Praying**

How can we pray for each other? Where do you feel challenged or convicted?

What can we praise God for?

How can we pray for our church?



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
